- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Feazell was seen for a release hearing at the Coyote Ridge Corrections Center on November 14, 2018.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Feazell is being seen by the Board in Pierce County Cause 97-1-05182-9 for Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Feazell shooting and killing a 20 year old male during a gang incident outside a club in Tacoma. Mr. Feazell was 17 years old at the time and is currently 38 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Fezell has had 11 serious infractions in 20 years and no serious infractions since 2011.

Mr. Fezell has completed a great deal of programming to include: Stress/Anger Management, Welding, Redemption, Roots of Success, Vocational Writing, Human Relations, obtaining his GED, completing numerous college level classes and more. He is currently employed as a Unit Custodian.

Mr. Fezell is working with Franklin Smith on a full release plan.

- **Decision**

The Board finds Mr. Fezell releasable on or about May of 2020 after transition through lower levels of custody.

- **Reasons:**

- Has completed risk related offender programming
- Has participated in training to be employable in the community
- No serious infractions since 2011
- Only 11 serious infractions in 20 + years

- **Next Action:**

Submit Offender release plan (ORP) in January of 2020. The Board would also like Mr. Fezell to complete Bridges to Life if possible.

Recommendations:

Continue to demonstrate positive prison behavior and deal with stressors as they come up. The Board expects Mr. Fezell to follow all rules of each facility he passes through on his way to release and to be respectful to staff. Negative behavioral observations, minor infractions and of course serious infractions will be monitored closely.
