DECISION AND REASONS

This matter came before the above named Board Members of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB or the Board) for a .100 hearing in accordance with RCW 9.95.100. In preparation for the hearing, the Board reviewed Mr. Alishio's ISRB file. Mr. Alishio appeared in person and was represented by Attorney Darrel Lahtinen. Testimony was provided by Department of Corrections (DOC) Classification Counselor (CC) Janet Busby and Ron Moon, Mental Health Therapist.

LAST BOARD DECISION:

At the June 6, 2017 hearing, the Board found Mr. Alishio conditionally parolable to a Mutual Reentry Plan (MRP) and added 24 months to his minimum term to complete this process.

CURRENT BOARD DECISION:

Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.009(3) and RCW 9.95.100 and the totality of evidence and information considered by the Board, the Board finds that Mr. Alishio is parolable.

NEXT ACTION:

Submit an offender release plan (ORP) for consideration.

REASONS FOR DECISION:

This was a deferred decision following a full Board discussion, using a structured decision-making framework that takes into consideration; the statistical estimate of risk, criminal history, release history, ability to control behavior, responsivity to programming, demonstrated offender change, release planning, discordant information, and other case specific factors. Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.100, the Board finds Mr. Alishio parolable for the following reasons:

- Completed the Crossroads Program at MSU as recommended by the Board
- No serious infractions since 2010 and no violent infractions since 1994
- Completed risk related treatment (SOTAP) in 1995 and again in 2017 to include aftercare
- Risk likely reduced due to age and medical issues

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Mr. Alishio will need to maintain absolute sobriety upon his release. He will be expected to complete the community phase of sex offender treatment and to participate in sober support groups regularly and consistently throughout his period of parole. It will be imperative that he establish a prosocial support system in the community as well. Mr. Alishio should be prohibited from driving a motor vehicle without a good deal of restrictions imposed. For instance he should be required to maintain an accurate mileage log, track all travel, not provide rides to any female, etc.

JURISDICTION:

Edward Alishio is under the jurisdiction of the Board on an October 21, 1980, conviction in King County Cause #80-1-02215-2 for Count I - Rape in the First Degree While Armed with a Deadly Weapon (WAWADW). The time start is January 20, 1981. The minimum term was set at 169 months from a SRA (Sentencing Reform Act) adjusted range of 90 to 114 months. The maximum

term is Life. Mr. Alishio has served approximately 37 years and ten months in prison and zero days of jail time (101 days of Phelan credit were applied in the adjusted sentencing range).

It should be noted that Mr. Alishio was also convicted under this cause number on Count III - Rape in the Second Degree to run concurrently with Count I. Count III had a ten year maximum term that expired in 1990.

OFFENSE DESCRIPTION:

According to file materials regarding Count I, on June 7, 1980, Mr. Alishio, at his age of 25, raped an unknown 32 year old female. Her vehicle had run out of gas and Edward Alishio stopped to provide assistance. Mr. Alishio initially asked the female to accompany him to get gas for her car, but she refused. When he returned with the gas, Mr. Alishio leaned into the victim's car while armed with a knife and told her, "This is a rape." He attempted to penetrate the victim's vagina, but was unsuccessful. He proceeded to masturbate and ejaculate on the victim. He left the victim in her car and took the knife and the victim's wallet with him, accidentally leaving his own wallet in her vehicle. Mr. Alishio was arrested on June 10, 1980, on this count; however, he was released two days later on his personal recognizance.

In regards to Count III, file materials indicate that on July 13, 1980, Mr. Alishio raped an unknown 29 year old woman who had been walking on a main highway. Mr. Alishio offered the woman a ride and she accepted. He asked the victim if she "wanted sex" and she declined. Mr. Alishio then grabbed the victim by her hair and threatened to kill her if she did not engage in sex with him. Mr. Alishio was unable to vaginally rape the victim with his penis but digitally penetrated her anus. The victim reported the rape immediately afterwards and was able to provide police with Mr. Alishio's name and the license number of his vehicle.

PRIOR CRIMINAL / RISK RELATED CONDUCT:

Mr. Alishio has a lengthy criminal history that began when he was age 11. As a juvenile he had a number of sex related convictions to include Indecent Liberties at age 14 and Attempted Rape at

age 15, which resulted in his commitment to the Child Study and Treatment Center at Western State Hospital (WSH) in 1970. He was also arrested for Exposing at age 17.

Mr. Alishio was convicted of a sexually motivated Assault Second Degree at age 18, for which he was committed to the Sexual Psychopathy Program at WSH, which he did not successfully complete. This offense involved an attempted rape and abduction at gunpoint.

PROGRESS/BEHAVIOR:

Classification Counselor Busby testified Mr. Alishio has been doing well at MSU in the camp setting. He has completed Bridges to Life and the Crossroads program. She stated his Washington One was completed and his RLC is Low. He previously completed chemical dependency but completed it again recently at the MSU. He has some medical issues that will need to be addressed upon release. He has previous work experience and hopes to become employed in the community. He does have a degree in horticulture. He has an acceptance letter from the “Mack House” in Snohomish County and hopes to release there.

Mr. Alishio expressed a commitment to seek help in the community as issues arise. He hopes to have a good relationship with his supervising CCO as well as the men in the transition house he will release to. He stated he will attend Alcoholics Anonymous in the community to maintain his sobriety. He also agreed to continue to participate in mental health treatment in the community.

Ron Moon stated he has worked with Mr. Alishio since January of 2018. He has completed the Crossroads program and has been active on the living unit. He was hired as a clerk in the Crossroads program. Mr. Alishio takes prescribed medications and knows he will need to remain on these upon release. Mr. Moon stated Mr. Alishio took on a new hobby and makes very detailed origami items, winning several awards at the local fair last year.

A Forensic Psychological Evaluation (FPE) was completed by Dr. Amy Phenix in 2017. Dr. Phenix noted that she did not have “sufficient evidence to consider that Mr. Alishio continues to suffer from a paraphilic disorder.” She went on to note that this is due to the length of time since his

last sex offense and reduction in libido due to Mr. Alishio's age. Dr. Phenix assessed Mr. Alishio's risk with the Static-99R and the Static-2002R as average to above-average, however she also indicated that "the associated absolute probabilities are quite low." Dr. Phenix did not find Mr. Alishio to meet criteria as a sexually violent predator due to his age, his successful treatment compliance and the supervision requirement upon his release.
