The Washington Department of Corrections is providing all the names of offenders potentially affected by the sentencing miscalculation between 2002 and 2015.

It is important to note that many of the offenders, whose names are being released, fully served their time in prison and were not affected by the miscalculation. The department cast a broad search inquiry when researching who could have been affected.

Based on research to date, DOC is finding that approximately 23 percent of the 2011-2015 offenders under review are not affected by the miscalculation, and never owed additional time. The vast majority of the remaining offenders (68 percent) were credited for time spent in the community without breaking any laws and do not owe any time.

## Today's information comes in two parts:

- The department is providing an updated list of offenders affected by the sentencing miscalculation from <a href="December 2011 through December 2015">December 2015</a>. DOC began looking at offenders released most recently and has worked backward in time. The updated list includes the offender's DOC number, full name, county of origin, original release date and adjusted release date.
- In addition, the department is providing a second list of offenders who were potentially affected by the sentencing miscalculation between 2002 and 2011. The updated list includes the offender's DOC number, full name, county of origin, and original release date.

For the second list of offenders, the department placed priority on determining the adjusted release dates for offenders convicted of Class A and sex offense felonies after release to determine if the crime occurred in the window they otherwise would have been in prison. After several intensive reviews, two were found to have committed new offenses during that window. One of the offenders was convicted of Assault 1 and the other of Robbery 1. Their names have been posted to the agency website as offenders alleged to have committed a crime within the window.
