**Risk Rating for Dimension 1:**

- 4  High withdrawal risk requiring hospitalization
- 3.5  Minimal risk of severe withdrawal, or manageable
- 3.3  Minimal risk of severe withdrawal
- 3.1  Minimal risk of severe withdrawal, or stable
- 2.5  Moderate risk of severe withdrawal
- 2.1  Minimal risk of severe withdrawal
- 1  Minimal risk of severe withdrawal
- 0  No signs or symptoms of intoxication or withdrawal are present, or signs/symptoms, if present, are resolving

**Risk Rating for Dimension 2:**

- 4  Incapacitated with severe medical problems, requires hospitalization
- 3.5  None or stable, or receiving concurrent medical monitoring
- 3.3  None or stable, or receiving concurrent medical monitoring
- 3.1  None or not a distraction from treatment
- 2.5  Not a barrier to treatment but severe enough to distract from recovery efforts (e.g., chronic back pain)
- 2.1  None or not a distraction from treatment
- 1  None or manageable with medical monitoring
- 0  No biomedical conditions that will interfere with treatment

**Risk Rating for Dimension 3:**

- 4  Severe psychiatric symptomology, disability, and impulsivity
- 3.5  Repeated inability to control impulses to use substances, is in imminent danger of harm to self, others, or property
- 3.3  Co-existing criminogenic disorder is of such severity that dysfunctional behaviors require continuing structured interventions
- 3.1  Functional limitations are severe enough to interfere with abstinence outside of a residential setting
- 2.5  Mild to moderate severity, with potential to distract from recovery; needs stabilization
- 2.1  Mild severity, with the potential to distract from recovery; needs monitoring
- 1  None or has a mental health diagnosis that is manageable in an outpatient structured environment
- 0  No emotional, behavioral or cognitive conditions that require treatment

**Risk Rating for Dimension 4:**

- 4b  Unable to follow through with treatment recommendations resulting in **imminent danger of self or others, immediate intervention required**
- 4a  Unable to follow through, has little or no awareness of substance use problems and associated negative consequences
- 3.5  Has significant difficulty with treatment with negative consequences; impaired coping skills, often blames others
- 3.3  Despite serious consequences individual has marked difficulty understanding the relationship between substance use and impaired coping skills
- 3.1  Individual attributes substance use disorder problem to other persons or external events and not likely to succeed in an outpatient setting
- 2.5  Has poor engagement in treatment, significant ambivalence, or a lack of awareness of the substance use disorder problem
- 2.1  Variable engagement, ambivalence, or a lack of awareness of the substance use disorder problem
- 1  Ready for recovery but needs motivating or monitoring strategies to strengthen readiness
- 0  Willing to engage in treatment/education as proactive, responsible participant, committed to changing alcohol, tobacco, and/or other drug use

**Risk Rating for Dimension 5:**

- 4  **Continued use places the individual/others in imminent danger. Intensive intervention required (Level 3.3, 3.5, or 3.7)**
- 3.5  Lifetime of repeated incarcerations with a pattern of relapse and uninterrupted use outside of incarceration
- 3.3  Continued use with criminal and addictive behavior consequences that pose **imminent risk to public safety**

- 3.1  Limited coping skills to address relapse triggers, in imminent danger of emotional, behavioral, or cognitive consequences
- 2.5  Intensification of addiction symptoms despite participation in a less intensive program indicates high likelihood of relapse
- 2.1  Intensification of addiction symptoms indicates a high likelihood of relapse without close monitoring and support
- 1  Able to maintain abstinence and pursue recovery with minimal support
- 0  Low relapse or continued use potential and good coping skills

**Risk Rating for Dimension 6:**

- 4b  Environment is not supportive of addiction recovery, and is actively hostile to recovery posing an immediate threat to the safety and well-being. **Immediate intervention required**
- 4a  Environment is not supportive of addiction recovery, and is chronically hostile and toxic to recovery or treatment progress
- 3.5  Environment is characterized by moderately high risk of neglect, physical, sexual, or emotional abuse
- 3.3  Environment is high risk and individual lacks skills to cope outside of a highly structured setting
- 3.1  Social network involves living in environment that is so heavily invested in substance use that recovery goals are not achievable
- 2.5  Environment is not supportive but with structure and support and relief from home environment the individual can cope
- 2.1  Environment is not supportive but with structure and support the individual can cope
- 1  Environment is supportive and/or the individual has the skills to cope
- 0  Has a supportive environment, or is able to cope with poor support
