Washington ONE assessment

• Assessment to determine criminogenic risk and needs

Programming

• Various programs offered to address criminogenic needs as identified in the Washington ONE assessment and life skills (Thinking for a Change, Anger Management, etc.)

Education

Education programs such as General Education Development (GED) and college courses

Treatment

• Treatment is available for mental health, chemical dependency, and sex offenses

Vocation Training and Employment

Various vocational training and employment experience opportunities

Reentry Team Meeting (RTM)

Collaborative meetings with the individual and reentry team members. • Involvement in RTMs are standard for GRE and CPA and are used as needed for individuals at Reentry Centers
