Graduated Reentry

Screening and Eligibility Simplified

Do you know an incarcerated individual who might benefit from the GRE program? What you need to know about our screening and eligibility process:

- No application required. Individuals are screened from a targeted eligibility list. There is a <u>screening process</u> in place to determine eligibility/suitability, however, not all individuals are guaranteed to be screened.
- Estimated time frame for screening Track 1 individuals is roughly between 24 and 7 months to ERD
 - Track 1: Individuals who serve a minimum of six months in total confinement in a state correctional facility may:
 - Transfer with up to 5 months remaining on their sentence to electronic monitoring at an approved address or
 - Be transferred to a Reentry Center when there is up to 12 months left on the sentence with the expectation that up to the final 5 months of the sentence will be served in an approved residence on electronic home monitoring.
 - o Individuals on this track must meet the following legislative criteria:
 - Not subject to deportation order,
 - Not subject to civil commitment order, or
 - Not part of the interstate compact for out of state releases.
- Estimated time frame for screening Track 2 individuals is roughly between 24 and 7 months to ERD
 - Track 2: Individuals who serve a minimum of 4 months total confinement in a state correctional facility may transfer with up to 18 months remaining on their sentence to electronic monitoring at an approved address. Individuals on this track must meet the following legislative criteria:
 - Not serving a sentence for a violent/sex offenses or crimes against a person
 - Not required to register for a current or previous offense*
 - Not subject to deportation order, or
 - Not under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board
 - Not part of the interstate compact for out of state releases*

- Per <u>SB 5502</u>, which was implemented July 2023, all individuals determined eligible to participate in GRE are required to complete a substance use disorder assessment prior to transfer to GRE.
