TCRC is in the southeastern area of Washington state. The facility is located near the historic downtown area in the city of Kennewick. TCRC has served the community since 1999. The primary goal is to improve public safety by positively changing lives and assisting their transition into the community.

Residents who meet the screening criteria may be transferred up to 12 months before their earliest release date. The Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) operates the facility and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance. DOC owns the building.
