Current Status

The Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) currently has 4 facilities on outbreak status. There were 20 prison and work release facilities on outbreak status on January 24, 2022. DOC's priority is the health and safety of staff and everyone in its care and custody.

DOC facilities and living units that are not on outbreak status are finding ways to safely resume religious and educational programming, visitation, and other activities that are important for an individual's successful reentry to the community. When a facility has a limited area outbreak in a specific living unit, only those living units are impacted, while the remainder of the facility is able to continue normal operations.

DOC announced an update to prison and work release visitation status on February 22, 2022.

When prison and work release facilities experience a COVID-19 outbreak they send out a weekly status update message that can be viewed on the department's <u>Significant Events Timeline (SET</u>). You can search for information about a specific facility by visiting the SET, hitting ctrl+f, and typing in the acronym of the facility you are interested in.

Starting the week of April 25, 2022, the COVID-19 Bulletin will move from two times weekly, to one time weekly on Wednesdays, not to include holidays.
