Current Status

The Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) recently updated its COVID-19 protocols based on updated guidance from Washington State Department of Health and updated <u>Centers for Disease Control Guidance for Correctional and Detention Facilities</u>.

The goal of these updates is to provide a thoughtful and informed approach to guide employees and instruct employee interactions while maintaining a safe environment. Some of the most impactful changes are as follows, but please be sure to read the documents carefully.

- Updated Prison, Reentry and Community Corrections checklists
- The activation of Limited Area Cluster/Outbreak designations are being increased from 2 cases to 4 cases, except for designated high risk areas
 - High-risk areas are defined as facility In-Patient Units (IPU), CRCC Sage-East, MCC-WSR-A
- Duration of Clusters reduced from 14 days to 10 days
- Eliminates intake separation in reception facilities.
