## Weekly Update from Superintendent Key

- Regarding staff and population tone, there is still talk about the Regional Care Facility (RCF) and we are continuing to send out memos to staff and incarcerated. We are out talking with population and staff and trying to answer individual questions.
- AHCC currently has 24 COVID cases. There are 16 individuals in the RCF, 4 in IPU, and 4 on hospitalization. AHCC has 2 on isolation and 1 on quarantine.
- We are working with HQ on our quality assurance checklist. Some of these checklists have been adopted state wide. HQ will be sending a staff member out state wide to make sure social distancing and COVID-19 protocols are being followed.
- As a department 113 incarcerated individuals have tested positive and 76 are still active.
- 75,000 N-95 masks were received at HQ and will be sent out to the institutions.
- Kiosks are still offline. There is going to be an update on Friday, 6/19/20.
- Senate Bill 6764 went into effect June 11<sup>th</sup>. The bill talks about the extension of immediately family to aunts, uncles, and immediate family adopted as a child or an adult. It also states the Indigent level went from \$10 to \$25 dollars and it increases access to commissary to at least 26 times a year or once every 2 weeks.
- Senate Bill 6164 is legislation relating to prosecution to petition the court to resentence. Nowhere in this bill does it speak to what DOC does or that DOC is involved with this bill. An individual can contact a prosecutor and if it fits into the definition of this bill they can move forward with a resentencing petition. I did not see any mention of DOC working within this bill.
- We received 18 grievances in the MAIN since our last call. These were in regards to porter pay due to COVID, PPE issues, COVID-19 positive incarcerated in RCF, COVID positive in N unit (which we do not have anyone positive in N unit), and a situation resolved in L unit thinking a COVID-19 positive incarcerated was transferred into L unit.
- MSU had 8 emergency grievances.

## Follow up items from 6/10/20

### Question

Is there a process whereby the concerns of the incarcerated are communicated with the LFC members, namely having the minutes of the tier rep meetings sent to LFC members attached as an addendum prior to or after the teleconference calls?

### Answer

We checked with other facilities to see if they are distributing their tier rep minutes to LFC members. This is not happening as tier rep meetings are not based around COVID-19 and the LFC teleconference is. We can continue to give you updates on the tier rep meeting topics.

### Question

Is there an update on the delivery of the K unit bikes?

### Answer

2 bicycles were delivered to K unit 6/11/20.

### Question

Has there been a follow up on the L unit microwaves?

### Answer

L unit received one extra microwave per tier on 6/17/20.

### Question

Is the population still getting 2 bars of soap weekly?

### Answer

We currently have 925 bars of soap and another 16000 on order scheduled to arrive in the 2-3 weeks. MSU and MI3 are not receiving weekly deliveries as they access to hand soap at the sink in the bathrooms. Medium units are still receiving weekly deliveries.
