Service Animals



Pets

Service animals may accompany people with disabilities onto prison grounds provided they follow all guidelines.

Guidelines:

- The animal must not be noisy or aggressive.
- The animal cannot interact with anyone besides the handler.
- The animal must accompany the handler at ALL times.
- The animal must stay off the furniture.
- The handler must keep the animal under control at all times.
- The animal cannot be fed or receive snacks.

Pets are not allowed on prison grounds. No Exceptions.

You may be asked:

Is this service animal required because of a disability?

What work or task has the animal been trained to perform?

If your animal is engaging in inappropriate or disruptive behavior such as wandering around, barking, eating, or nipping/biting, the service animal may be asked to be removed and the facility may not authorize the handler to return to visiting that day.

It is a misdemeanor to falsely represent a pet as a service animal.

The punishment for a misdemeanor can be a fine of up to \$1000 and/or up to 90 days in jail.
