- Minimum Security Classification Facility (MI1 and MIG)

Capacity:

- 53 women

Annual Operating Budget:

- \$2,770,074

HBRRRC, established in 1988 as an all-female reentry center, is located in Seattle's Beacon Hill neighborhood, just minutes from downtown. This partial confinement residential facility offers convenient access to public transportation and is situated close to many local businesses. HBRRRC provides a child visitation and overnight program, allowing mothers to build and sustain bonds with their children. The center's core mission is to improve public safety by helping women rebuild their lives through connection, growth and opportunity. Residents who meet the screening criteria may be transferred to HBRRRC 18 months before their earliest release date. The facility is leased and operated by the Washington State Department of Corrections and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance.
