### ABOUT

#### Custody Level:

- Minimum Security Classification Facility

#### Capacity:

- 69 men, 6 women

#### Annual Operating Budget:

- \$4,434,000

Tacoma Reentry Center (TRC) is located in the northern area of Tacoma, bordering the water of the Puget Sound area, and will open fall of 2025. The facility is surrounded by well-established local businesses in a residential community. TRC is a co-ed 75-bed facility for adult residents with the primary goal to improve public safety by positively changing lives and reconnecting with families by providing residents with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in the community.

The average age range of individuals is 18 to 65 years of age with an average length of stay of 4-12 months but can extend to 18 months if on Graduated Reentry (GRE). The facility is operated by the Washington State Department of Corrections and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance. The Department of Corrections leases the building.
