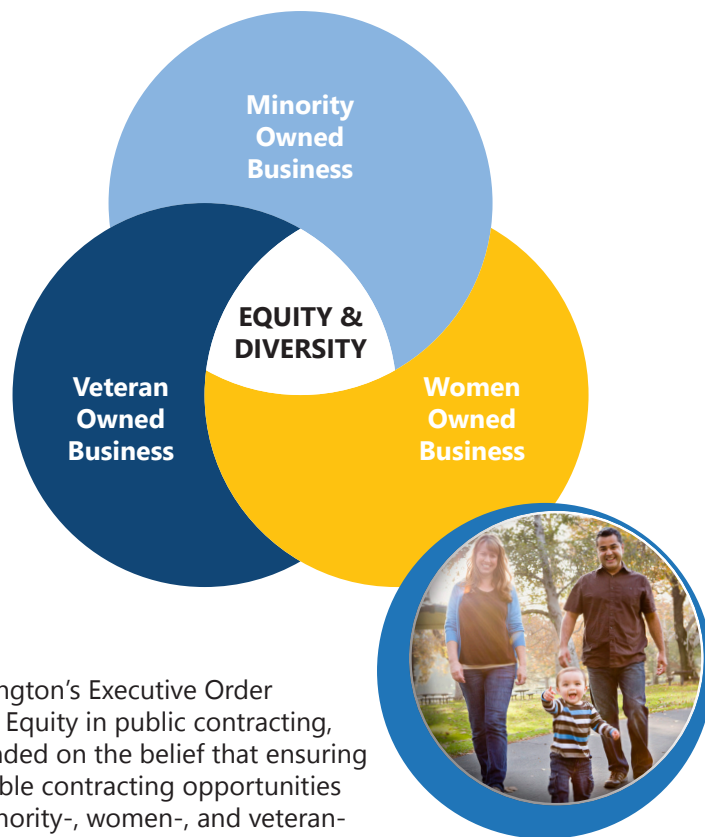

Washington's Executive Order 22-01, Equity in public contracting, is founded on the belief that ensuring equitable contracting opportunities for minority-, women-, and veteran-owned businesses gives the state government access to a wider array of business solutions, helps drive innovation, strengthens economic growth and makes Washington's economy and families more resilient, strengthens our communities, and improves the quality of life for all Washingtonians.

Find Your Opportunity

Washington state has awarded 190 Master Contracts to over 1,500 businesses for agencies to order goods and services. Consider competing for those contracts when they are solicited. Go to:

How To Start

Washington law requires state agencies to take steps to increase participation of minority, women, and veteran owned businesses in state contracting. Get started by getting state certified in one or more programs by visiting the Office of Women and Minority Business Enterprises (for minority or women owned business) and/or Washington's Department of Veterans Affairs (for veteran owned business). Once certified, get registered at the Washington Electronic Business System (WEBS).

What We Purchase

The Department of Corrections purchases goods and services in support of it's facilities across the state. Here is a quick (but not comprehensive) list:

Ammunition, tactical gear, safety and security equipment

Beauty salon and barber supplies

Building materials such as lumber, fencing, roofing, windows and flooring

Educational and training services and supplies

Electrical, plumbing, and wastewater specialized services and supplies

Facilities maintenance supplies, programing, visiting, and recreational items such as musical instruments, games, books, exercise and gym equipment

Food, snacks, beverages & catering

Heavy duty and passenger vehicles and mechanical services like oil changes or repairs

Industrial and construction equipment, supplies, and hardware

IT services and hardware/software

Janitorial services

Laundry, kitchen, and food service equipment and supplies

Landscaping equipment and supplies such as plants, soil and rock

Office supplies

Rental equipment
